Susie An is the business reporter for 91.5 WBEZ-FM, Chicago Public Media. Young Moon is a 2014 graduate of Northwestern University School of Law, where she served as an Executive Editor for the *Journal of International Law and Business* and worked in the Criminal Defense Clinic. She will be joining the Chicago office of Skadden, Arps, Slate, Meagher & Flom this September.
